

**Pupil Premium****Background information**

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after (LAC) continuously for more than 6 months.

From 2012-13 this will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils identified to receive this funding.

From September 2012, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the extra Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

**Use of Pupil Premium 2014-15**

<b>Number of children and pupil premium grant (PPG) received.</b>

In 2014-15 Cheapside CE Primary School received £7,920 for Pupil Premium. Other funding continued to be added to this to ensure that we were supporting our most disadvantaged pupils.

Money was spent on:

£150 – Gifted and Talented activities

£1,050 – School clubs

£3,517 – Interventions and small group work

£800 -To fund an ELSA (emotional literacy support assistant)

£1,173 – School Trips

£1,601 – Additional class support

**Impact from Pupil Premium spending**

We have chosen not to publish any data regarding progress made by children in receipt of pupil premium in relation to their peers as the number of children involved would make them easily identifiable and this would not be appropriate. Pupil Premium spend and its impact is discussed and monitored with our Governing Body.
