

Premium Spending for 2014/15**Sports Premium**

The government is continuing to provide additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Premium Spending for 2014/15**Sports Premium**

In the academic year 2014/15 our school received £8246 for the year. This funding was spent on:

- To part fund a swimming instructor to work alongside school staff to deliver swimming lessons to all children and run synchronised swimming and life-saving after school
- To part fund class cover during the teaching of swimming lessons
- To part fund a fully qualified PE teacher to support the teaching staff in the delivery of our PE curriculum through high-quality CPD
- To part fund organisation of a rolling programme of sporting events and afterschool sports clubs. (Timetabling, risk assessing, organising staffing, liaising with parents and cluster schools and overall management of sports events)
- To fund Teaching Assistants to assist at after school clubs and matches re: supervision, inclusion and health and safety
- To fund coaches to swimming gala practices and the swimming gala at Bracknell Leisure centre
- To fund the School Sport Partnership

Impact Statement

- With the rolling programme of sporting events and afterschool sports clubs, participation in sporting events continued to be strong with other schools and children took great pride in participating and representing the school.
- Using teaching assistants for after-school clubs ensured that every child could participate in sporting activities. It also supported our participation in sporting events by ensuring adequate staffing ratios during club sessions and at events.
- Our gala squad understood the rules of participation and were familiar with the expectations prior to the swimming gala. As a result of these pre-visits, the squad maintained its place in its division, with children receiving many rosettes.
- Children can participate in a sport that is not usually available in primary schools with a specialist coach.
- Joining the School Sports Partnership has allowed us to participate in inter-school competitions and have support from secondary sports leaders.
- 5 teachers worked in partnership with a swimming teacher to deliver swimming lessons. They gained significantly in their knowledge of the teaching of swimming and mirrored the swimming teacher's lessons during an additional session later in the week. Children experienced a term of swimming lessons of quality equal to that provided by external swimming schools and parents were able to see the children's progress during a demonstration lesson. As well as group teaching within a class, the swimming teacher also taught 1:1 and paired sessions to ensure inclusion for all. All children from the age of 4 upwards received this specialist teaching, as a result of having a swimming pool on site and making best possible use of it.
The swimming teacher taught life-saving and synchronised swimming in clubs after school. As a result, children who took part now have an important life skill and children who previously had not taken part in any sporting activities, joined her clubs.

In the academic year of 2015/16, the school expects to receive similar funding of £8246 for the year. This funding will be spent on:

- To run training for year 5/6 children to develop their leadership skills during lunchtime duties with younger children

- To part fund organisation of a rolling programme of sporting events and afterschool sports clubs. (Timetabling, risk assessing, organising staffing, liaising with parents and cluster schools and overall management of sports events)
