### School Lunches and On-line Payments

Our current contract with Pabulum expires at the end of the summer term. The Head teachers of five schools within the "Ascot Cluster Group" have joined forces to find a new contractor to supply all five schools. This working group has worked with a professional catering consultant to find the best catering company to deliver what we want.

Following a thorough tender process, and suppliers giving an in-depth insight into their vision for the schools, menus, special diets, quality, displays, communication and how they would interact with the parents & PTA as well as sampling food, we are very excited to announce that Wilson Jones has been appointed as the new catering contractor. The company has already begun liaising with the schools to ensure a smooth transition for September and further details will follow.

It is the policy of the new caterers to take payments for lunches on-line. The school is in the process of setting this facility up, not just for lunches, but for uniform payments, donations for trips and other voluntary contributions.



### New Laptops

The staff and children welcomed sponsors of their 'Laptop Appeal' to an open morning in school on Thursday, 26th May. Children from all classes showcased their skills on the set of brand new class

laptops (35 in total) which the generosity of the sponsors has enabled the school to purchase. Funding has been achieved in a number of ways. The school was also fortunate to receive additional finances from a parent through the matched funding scheme of his employer Microsoft.
