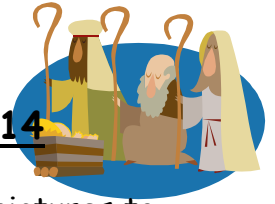




## Wrens Newsletter - Week Beginning 07/12/2014

Examples of the kind of things that you could send in:

*Jack has worked really hard in his swimming lessons and is now on level 2. We are really proud of him.*

*Sophie remembered how to write the word 'the'.*

*Harriet has been very helpful at home. She is keeping her bedroom tidy and helps to look after her little brother.*

*Harry read all the numbers from 1-20 on the doors as we walked home from school.*

*If you notice your child achieving something for the first time then please tell us about it. Write it down on a piece of paper, take a photo and then we can add these 'wow' moments to your child's folder.*
