Marist Cross Country

On Thursday 9th March, 15 children from years 4, 5 and 6 took part in a Cross-Country event at the Marist School. Many other schools entered and everybody did very well.

Year 6's ran first, followed by year 5 and year 4.

The Course measured 1.8km (1800m), with most of it through woods and forests. Cheapside received 1 bronze medal, won by Dalia (year 6). The year 5 team (the first four children to finish from Cheapside), came 4th overall and the year 6 team came 3rd overall.

Evie was the first year 5 girl across the finish line, in 4th place and Sophie (our only year 4 entrant) came 10th in her category.

All were exhausted after the event but snacks and drinks were available.



Netball Update

On 8th March, the Cheapside Netball Team took part in a High 5 Netball Tournament at Charters School. The matches were different in that 'wing' positions were not included and everyone had to be flexible in all positions since you were always subbing on and off the court.

Comic Relief





RBWM Library Service would like to invite all reception aged pupils to take part in the 2017 Summer Reading Challenge. To encourage them to read and use the library services, we would like to issue your child with a personalised library card which they can use at an RBWM Library during its normal opening hours and during the long school holidays.

For the cards to be issued, your child's surname, forename, DOB, gender and home address is required. If you are happy for this information to be passed on to Library Services, then there is nothing further that you need to do. The library card together with information for parents/carers will be given to your child during the Summer Term.

If, however, you do **NOT** want your child to have a library card, you will need to let the school know by 27th March 2017.
