



Wren Class Newsletter - Week Beginning 08/10/2018.

The children in Wren Class were AMAZING this week! We went along to our first assembly on Friday which can be quite daunting as the whole school attends. However, the children were fantastic and sat beautifully for quite a long time listening to Mrs Searle, joining in with singing and helping celebrate children's achievements within the school. Mrs Searle was so impressed that she personally visited the children and gave them one of her 'special' stickers.

During our phonics lessons this week we have practised the graphemes (letters) I, M, N and D. We have learnt the phoneme (sound) and also practised writing the letters on whiteboards. The children had a go at listening to words using sound talk and trying to write the matching letters to spell the words. The children had a go at writing at, it and sat. Please continue to practise these letters using the resources recommended in the children's reading packs.

At the beginning of the week, as part of our RE lessons, we investigated how we help each other, how this makes us and others feel, who might be a 'role model' in our lives and why we have rules and how we can help ourselves to follow them. The children had some good ideas that they shared with each other.

The children enjoyed Forest School and PE on Wednesday with Mrs Summers. She will be posting regular updates on their Forest school sessions on the website under the Forest School page so please take a look and see what your children have been up to !

On Thursday we had a science investigation day. The children explored the five senses and took part in activities such as listening to sounds, smelling different herbs and plants, tasting sweet, sour, bitter and salty foods, touching different textures and looking at optical illusions that trick our eyes.

During Maths we explored repeating patterns and the children had a go at making their own using coloured paints, shape printing and making patterns using pegs and cubes. We have also continued to practise counting, ordering and recognising numbers.

Finally, a reminder that the Harvest Festival is on Tuesday at the church starting at 230pm. If you would like to help the children walk up to the church, please let the office staff know. You would need to be at school by 110pm. The children will not be returning to school and will need to be collected from the church at 315pm. The children have been busy practising a harvest song so if you can make it, they would love you to come and watch!
