



Wren Class Newsletter - Week Beginning 15/10/2018.

Another AMAZING week from the children in Wren Class! If you were able to attend the Harvest Festival at the church on Tuesday, I am sure that you felt as proud as we did. The children sang so beautifully and loud! We were very proud of them as at first a lot of the children were feeling a little nervous about singing in front of an audience but when they arrived at the church they were feeling quite excited about the performance. Well done Wren Class!

During our phonics lessons this week we have practised the graphemes (letters) G, O, C and K. We have learnt the phoneme (sound) and also practised writing the letters on whiteboards. The children had a go at listening to CVC words using sound talk and trying to find the matching magnetic letters to spell the words. The children had a go at recognising the high frequency words in, it, is, at, and. Please continue to practise these letters and words using the resources recommended in the children's reading packs.

At the beginning of the week we read the book 'The Little Red Hen' and the children completed some work on changing the story by suggesting different animals and endings. We also learnt about why we celebrate harvest time. The children enjoyed lots of activities such as experimenting making patterns on bread to make rainbows, decorating hedgehog pictures and creating observational paintings of fruit and vegetables.

On Thursday and Friday, the children explored 2D shapes and their properties. We chatted about how many sides and corners a rectangle, square, circle and triangle have. The children took part on a 2D shape hunt around the school and drew aliens using shapes.

The children also designed a Christmas card which they took home in their book bags on Friday. These cards can be ordered by completing the form and will raise money for the school.
